Greetings from Lt Gov. Bob

We are near the half way point of this Kiwanis Year and I believe that we are definitely making progress on moving Division 10W from "Good to Great". I set out this year with three main goals and they were: 5% membership increase in the division, with all clubs with at least 25 members. Continued strong support of our Service Leadership Programs. Increased member participation in service projects

Division 10W increased by 7 members as of February 29; which is a growth of just over 1%. Our Division currently has the highest growth in membership in all of the Ohio District. That is something to be proud of!! However, we are still a little ways away from the 5% growth goal, which would be a membership gain of 31 members. I ask that each club focuses on membership growth as one of its top priorities. I have faith that all of our clubs can end the year with a positive membership gain.

Our Division does a great job supporting 2 Circle K Clubs, 11 Key Clubs, 1 K-Kids Club, and 1 Aktion Club. At the upcoming Division Council Meeting in Washington Court House April 21, we will be focusing on our Service Leadership Programs and will have a few guest speakers in attendance. If your club does not sponsor one of these groups, you can gain some great information and hopefully strongly consider chartering a new Service Leadership Program club.

I am always amazed at all of the service projects that are reported each month. As we move into the new Spring Season consider adding a brand new project that would reach an area that you currently do not service.
